Side Table Cut List

The upper and lower crosspieces hold each pair of legs together.

¾-inch plywood shelf 15½ by 14 inches 1x2 upper crosspieces 2 @ 12¼ inches (from short point to short point) 1x3 lower crosspieces
2 @ 15 inches
(from short point to short point)

2x2 legs 4 @ 24¼ inches

The top and bottom edge of each leg is beveled at a 5-degree angle. (from short point to long point)

¾-inch plywood top 18 by 18 inche**s**

Round the edges of the tabletop under with a sanding block or a router fitted with a round-over bit.

1x2 tabletop skirt pieces 4 @ 12¼ inches (from short point to short point) 1x3 shelf
skirt pieces
4 @ 14¼ inches
(from short point
to short point)

The ends of the skirt and crosspieces are cut at opposing 5-degree angles so that when assembled in a square frame below the tabletop and shelf, they will tilt to follow the bevel on their top edge.

SIDE VIEW

The top edge of the legs, skirt, and crosspieces are beveled at a 5-degree angle so that when the legs are splayed, the top edge of each piece remains flat.
